

To: **ALL** OASL League Representatives, Club Managers and Head Coaches

All game scores must be submitted by e-mail. You still need to mail in the game cards. We are asking for all game outcomes to be posted on the league e-mail system the *day of the game*. We hope to get results out on the web site regularly this spring.

REMINDERS:

- After each game, both coaches should verify the results of the game with the referee.
Verify which team won, along with goals scored by each team.
- To promote good sportsmanship the maximum goal differential that will be accepted and used for standings is "5".
Teams are discouraged to run up scores on weaker opponents.
- **ALL RED CARDS MUST BE CALLED IN.**
- **U9 SSG ACTUAL GAME SCORES DON'T GET E-MAILED – Only points awarded from mini games should be e-mailed.** With the split game format, each mini game will consist of two-15minute periods. Two mini games per day. Total points available are **EIGHT** (4 games x 2points), regardless of the number of goals scored in a game. The team accumulating the most points out of the eight over two games is the winner. (Ties are 1point)

Example: Mini-game#1: team#1 wins over team #2 by a score of 4-2
Concurrent mini-game#2: team#1 loses to team #2 by a score of 7-0
Mini-game#3: team#1 wins over team #2 by a score of 7-0
Concurrent mini-game#4: team #1 ties team#2 by a score of 1-1

In this example, Team #1 earns a **5-3** win over team #2. WHY? Team #1 earned 2 points for mini-game #1, 2 points for mini-game #3, 1 point for mini-game#4. Team #2 earned 2 points for mini-game #2 and 1 point for mini-game #4.
- Please do NOT leave the names of individual players who scored. This tracking system is for *team* standings only.

QUESTIONS:

Who should be e-mailing the results? BOTH teams should e-mail game results.

When should they e-mail? *The day of the game*

What information should be e-mailed in? Please e-mail ALL the following information each time, in this order:

1. Age group
2. Age division and sub-division
3. *Club* name
4. Team number (*usually #1*)
5. Head coach name
6. Opponent *club* name
7. Opponent team number (*usually #1*)
- 8. Game number #**
9. Original game date
10. Actual game date
11. Actual game time
12. Actual location of game
13. Game outcome *for e-mailing club* (win, loss, tie)
14. Goals scored *by e-mailing club (except U9 call in points)*
15. Goals allowed *by e-mailing club (except U9 call in points)*
16. Scheduled referee present? (Yes or no)
17. Optional/other info (e.g., poor ref, unruly parents)

What if the game is postponed or cancelled? Send an e-mail message stating as much, as well as the new date if it has been set. League rules & fines (when applicable) for rescheduling or any game changes must be adhered to. Contact your club rep if you need clarification of these rules.

What if the coach wins but doesn't e-mail the result? Games that are not e-mailed in will be considered as NOT having been played... ZERO points. It is clearly in the interest of the winning coach to send the e-mail.

Who should be called for non-email questions? Contact your soccer club's OASL Representative. If they don't have the solution, they should be able to reach the appropriate league officials.
